JACKSON COUNTY BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS

I.C. 36-7-4-902 states after 1.2.84:

1. Composed of 5 members;
 - (a) 3 citizens members appointed by the executive of the county, one of which must be a member of the plan commission and two of which must not be members of the Plan Commission;
 - (b) 1 citizen member appointed by the County Council.

2. 1 Citizen member appointed by the Advisory Plan Commission who must be a member of the Plan Commission other than the one appointed by the Board of Commissioners.
3. Members must live within the jurisdictional area of the BZA, i.e. a member cannot live in Seymour (or its “fringe area”) or in Brownstown, Crothersville or Medora.
4. Commissioners may appoint an alternate member to participate in hearings in which a regular member has a conflict of interest. (See I.C. 36-7-4-907)
5. None of the members of a board of zoning appeals may hold an elected office or any other appointed office, except as permitted by section 902 of this chapter, in municipal, county, or state government.

- (d) One (1) member who is a mental health administrator, psychiatrist, psychologist or physician;
- (e) One (1) member who is a representative of a private correctional agency, if such an agency exists in the county;

- (f) One (1) member who is a victim;
 - (g) One (1) member who is a ex-offender;
 - (h) One (1) member who is an attorney with a substantial criminal defense practice or one (1) public defender;
 - (i) Four (4) lay persons, at least one (1) of who must be a member of a minority race.
- Appointments are for four (4) year terms.

Three (3) other members are appointed by the Judge of the Jackson Circuit Court. Ex-officio members of the board are: the Sheriff, Prosecuting attorney, Welfare Department Director and the Mayor of Seymour, or the designees of those officials.

This board was created by Ordinance 1989-9, and its governing rules are set out in Chapter 5 91-15-1 ET seq.) of the Jackson County Code, (amended by Ordinance 1992-7).
